He also mentors medical and nursing students by serving as a Preceptor. Dr. Latorre volunteers at Vicksburg's First Baptist Church Free Clinic and participates in the Walk With a Doc Vicksburg program each month in cooperation with organizer Mrs. Linda Fondren.
